Minor and machinery in nature	The permanent exemption from mutual recognition requirements will require beverage containers, that are within scope of the Victorian Container Deposit Scheme (CDS), to comply with the labelling requirements of the CDS to be legally sold in Victoria.
	As Queensland manufacturers exporting relevant beverages to Victoria are already subject to equivalent labelling requirements for goods sold in the other states and territories, there is likely to be negligible compliance costs for industry and no costs for the Queensland Government.
