Early Intervention and Rehabilitation

Queensland Fire Department State Headquarters

\$27.5 million for refurbishment of the new Queensland Fire Department State Headquarters.

Boondall police facility upgrade

Commencing the upgrade of the Boondall police facility, an investment of \$52 million.

Northside CCTV

\$500,000 to deliver CCTV upgrades across Mitchelton, Keperra and Alderley.

Additional POLAIR flight hours in South East Queensland

\$4 million to provide additional flight hours for POLAIR capability in South East Queensland, including in Brisbane North.

Enhancing the Victim Liaison Service at the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions

\$11.6 million over 4 years to enhance the support provided to victims of crime across the state by the Victim Liaison Service.

Secure Communities Partnership Program

\$40 million statewide to provide grants to small businesses and local governments across the state, to implement measures to improve community safety and prevent crime in public commercial and business precincts.

Victims Advocate Service

\$50 million to deliver a new professional Victims Advocate Service to provide dedicated support to victims of crime across the state, through the justice process.

Health services when you need them



More health workers

The Prince Charles Hospital expansion

The Prince Charles Hospital will be expanded with at least 93 new overnight beds as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital Central Reprocessing Department upgrades

\$48.7 million for equipment replacement and works at the RBWH Sterile Supply Department, as part of the newly uplifted Timely Investment Infrastructure Maintenance program.

Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital - Psychiatric Emergency Centre refurbishment

\$8.1 million to redesign the existing Psychiatric Emergency Centre (PEC) to enhance bed capacity and streamline patient flow.

Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital Dr James Mayne Roof and Link Bridge

\$6.2 million to replace the roof membrane of the Dr James Mayne building and replacement of roof and wall cladding and stormwater drainage associated with Link Bridge 2.

New Queensland cancer centre

Delivering a new cancer centre at the Herston Precinct as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

The Prince Charles Hospital fire detection upgrade

\$12.4 million to replace the fire detection, alarm systems and emergency lighting, as part of the newly uplifted Timely Investment Infrastructure Maintenance program.

Kedron Park clinical hub

\$7.6 million to construct a new clinical hub in the Emergency Services Complex in Kedron Park. Part of the Queensland Ambulance Service.

Hospital Rescue Plan

Delivering more than 2,600 extra beds across the state including 3 new hospitals and 10 hospital expansions and more regional health services.

Reducing ambulance ramping

Health services when you need them with more paramedics and initiatives to reduce ambulance ramping below 30 per cent by 2028.

Surgery Waitlist Stabilisation

\$1.8 billion to deliver more elective surgeries when and where Queenslanders need them including partnering with the private sector through the Surgery Connect Program to reduce waitlists and have patients seen sooner.

Real-time health data

Delivering the government's new Open Hospitals website to share data in real time and drive cultural change across the state.

Improving patient flow

\$581 million to stabilise bed capacity to improve patient flow across the state, with 515 beds across the Queensland Health system.

Midwife to patient ratios

\$48.7 million to deliver the legislated but previously unfunded midwife to patient ratios across the state.

Gympie Road and Beams Road intersection

Upgrading the intersection of Gympie Arterial Road and Beams Road in Carseldine including additional lanes on the southbound approach, 2 dedicated through lanes and a short left turn.

More social and community housing

\$57.8 million to expand and improve social and community housing, with 150 social homes in construction or under contract towards the delivery of 53,500 social and community homes by 2044, including in partnership with the Australian Government.

Frontline housing and homelessness services

Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders across the Brisbane North region to assist them to secure long-term housing and access other specialist support services including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services. This is provided through funding and partnerships with Specialist Homelessness Services.



Fire Ant Suppression Taskforce

\$24 million to continue the joint taskforce to oversee fire ant suppression activities, including in Brisbane North, by local governments, industry and Queensland Government.

Advanced Robotics Manufacturing Hub (ARM hub)

\$12.6 million to grow industry capability through the integration of robotics, artificial intelligence and other Industry 4.0 technologies into their manufacturing operations.

Locking In 50c Fares

Delivering long-term cost of living relief for commuters by making 50c fares permanent.

Boost to Buy to reduce the deposit gap

Reducing the deposit gap for 1,000 Queenslanders across the state who don't have savings to get into their first home.

Back to School Boost

Delivering cost of living relief with \$100 for every Queensland primary school child across the state, to cover the cost of school essentials every year.

\$1.8 million for the Aspley Hornets Football clubhouse, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Wavell Heights State School

\$1.3 million to upgrade fencing and security facilities at Wavell Heights State School.

Kedron State High School

\$24.9 million to deliver a performing arts centre.

Mitchelton Youth Club

\$250,000 to progress the business case and planning for a new facility at Mitchelton Youth Club Inc.

Bald Hills Memorial Hall amenities upgrade

\$300,000 to upgrade the Bald Hills Memorial Hall amenities block to improve accessibility.

Stafford Heights State School

\$20,000 to deliver interactive whiteboards.

Supporting Our Local Communities – Top Blokes mentoring programs

\$27,000 to fund mentoring programs run by the Top Blokes Foundation for Aspley State High School students.

Craigslea State School

To deliver a 'stop and go' facility, as part of the \$70.68 million School and Education Boost funding.

Games On! Brothers Rugby Club

\$6 million for upgrades at Brothers Rugby Club at Crosby Park, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Games On! Grange Thistle Football Club

\$1.5 million for a new artificial turf field at Grange Thistle Football Club, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Games On! Everton Park Roosters

\$750,000 for the Everton Park Roosters clubhouse, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030

\$35 million to partner with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure and prevent litter escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030.
