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# SCOPE AND PURPOSE OF THE CONSOLIDATED FUND FINANCIAL REPORT

# **Statutory Requirement**

The Financial Accountability Act 2009 (the Act) provides that at the end of every financial year the Treasurer shall prepare and transmit to the Auditor-General a statement containing particulars of transactions of the Consolidated Fund and details of appropriation paid to each Department (including adjustments to original appropriation). This statement, known as the Consolidated Fund Financial Report (CFFR), is to be transmitted to the Auditor-General by a date that allows the Auditor-General to complete the audit of the statement and prepare a report on it within three months after the end of the financial year. The statement and the report of the Auditor-General are then to be tabled in the Legislative Assembly by the Treasurer within fourteen days of their return by the Auditor-General.

This Act became effective 1 July 2009. Prior to 1 July 2009, the *Financial Administration and Audit Act 1977* applied. A number of approvals in relation to appropriation transfers were obtained under the previous Act. Consequently, this report makes reference to both Acts.

# **Consolidated Fund Accounts**

The Act requires the Treasurer to keep ledger accounts for the Consolidated Fund consisting of:

- the Treasurer's Consolidated Fund Operating Account; and
- the Treasurer's Consolidated Fund Investment Account.

The Act further provides for accountability for the management of public moneys and property to be given by Accountable Officers of Departments in the form of the establishment and keeping of Departmental Accounts, so as to produce general purpose financial statements prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and financial reporting requirements issued by the Treasurer. The general purpose financial statements are required to be included in Departmental annual reports to be given to the Minister in accordance with section 62 of the Act.

# **Basis of Accounting**

# Gross Cash Basis

Transactions are generally recorded in the Consolidated Fund accounts at the time of receipt, or issue of cash. In accordance with section 22(6) of the Act, payments made from and receipts paid to the Consolidated Fund within two weeks after the end of the financial year relating to the 2008–09 financial year are included in these statements. Thus, the Consolidated Fund Financial Report reports on the cash basis of accounting which contrasts with Departmental reporting which is on the accrual basis of accounting.

# Rounding

Amounts included in this statement have been rounded to the nearest \$1,000 or where that amount is \$500 or less, to zero.

Amounts may not add to totals both across and downwards due to rounding.

# **Meanings of Certain Words**

The following words appearing in the Statement of Appropriations have these meanings:

# Transfers

Transfers made under Section 79 of the Act represent the transfer of appropriation between departments approved by Governor in Council following a redistribution of Government business.

Treasurer's Transfers made under Section 33 of the Act and Section 24 of the *Financial Administration and Audit Act 1977* include transfers of appropriation between headings within a Department's vote, approved by the Treasurer.

# Unforeseen Expenditure

Unforeseen Expenditure refers to expenditure authorised by the Governor in Council, under section 35 of the Act, to be made in advance of appropriation. Such authorisation may be given for expenditure where there is no appropriation, or there is an appropriation but the making of the expenditure to a department's vote would mean that the amount allocated to the vote would be exceeded.

# Lapsed Appropriation

Lapsed Appropriation means appropriation that has lapsed under section 29 of the Act. This section states that where the available amount (total amount appropriated) is not paid to a Department within the financial year or within the further two weeks, the unpaid amount of the appropriation lapses at the end of the further two weeks.

# **Explanatory Notes to the Statement of Appropriations**

These explanatory notes are in relation to appropriation adjustments and explain the variance between the Appropriation Act amount, adjusted for section 79 (machinery of Government) transfers, and actual appropriation paid.

- 1. **Department of Child Safety** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Child Safety was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 2. Department of Communities Additional departmental services were primarily due to new receipts associated with the National Disability Agreement and Home and Community Care Agreement and receipts under the National Affordable Housing Agreement and the Nation Building and Jobs, Remote Indigenous Housing and Homelessness National Partnership Agreements. These were partially offset by lapses in equity adjustments from changes in the timing of expenditure from 2008-09 to 2009-10. Some of the lapses in equity adjustments were also applied to administered items for the reimbursement of Community Recovery expenses under the Natural Disaster Recovery and Relief scheme.
- 3. Department of Community Safety Additional departmental services were provided to Corrective Services to meet additional depreciation expenses associated with asset revaluations. These were offset by lapses in equity adjustments due to changes in the timing of capital expenditure largely relating to the South Queensland Correction Precinct, the Queensland Emergency Operations Centre and the expansion of Lotus Glen Correctional Centre.
- 4. **Department of Corrective Services** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Corrective Services was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 5. **Disability Services Queensland** Lapses in departmental services, due to changes in the timing of operating expenditure for the Disability Information System (DISQIS) from 2008-09 to 2009-10, were applied to meet additional equity adjustments. Additional equity adjustments primarily relate to funding provided for the purchase and construction of assets. As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, Disability Services Queensland was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 6. **Department of Education and Training** Additional departmental services were due to new appropriation arrangements for specific purpose payments, additional funding for Commonwealth programs, including Building the Education Revolution, and increased depreciation expenditure resulting from asset revaluation and general movement in the asset base. Additional equity adjustments reflect funding received for new Commonwealth programs, including Building the Education Revolution. Additional administered items reflect increased Commonwealth grants assistance to non-state schools, including the Building the Education Revolution.
- 7. **Electoral Commission of Queensland** Additional departmental services were provided for the conduct of the State general election held on 21 March 2009.
- 8. **Department of Emergency Services** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Emergency Services was abolished on 26 March 2009.

- 9. **Department of Employment and Industrial Relations** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Employment and Industrial Relations was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 10. Department of Employment, Economic Development and Innovation The lapses in departmental services were due to changes in the timing of expenditure mainly relating to the Queensland Renewable Energy Fund, the Queensland Smart Energy Savings Fund, the Western Hardwood Plan and milestone payments to Biopharmaecuticals Australia (Network) Pty Ltd. These lapses were partially applied to meet additional administered items. Additional administered items were provided for the Smart State Research Facilities Fund, increased grant payments to finance schemes administered by QRAA, including Exceptional Circumstances, and Community Service Obligation payments to Ergon. The lapses in equity adjustments reflect a shift in milestone payments for the continuing construction of the Ecosciences and Health and Food Sciences Precincts.
- 11. **Environmental Protection Agency** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Environmental Protection Agency was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 12. **Department of Environment and Resource Management** The lapses in departmental services were due to changes in the timing of expenditure largely relating to the Queensland Climate Change Fund and the return of funding for the Home Waterwise Rebate Scheme. These lapses were partially applied to meet additional equity adjustments provided for land acquisition in the Daintree region. The lapses in administered items were largely due to lower than budgeted land acquisitions for future dam sites as fewer than expected properties were available for purchase.
- 13. Department of Health Additional departmental services resulted from the new appropriation arrangements for specific purpose payments, increased funding for Commonwealth programs and increased funding for the impact of wage increases under the proposed enterprise bargaining framework. Lapses in equity adjustments reflect changes in the timing of capital expenditure largely relating to property, plant and equipment and health technology. These lapses were partially applied to meet additional departmental services and administered items. Additional administered items largely reflect increased funding for the Health Quality Complaints Commission.
- 14. **Department of Housing** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Housing was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 15. Department of Infrastructure and Planning Additional departmental services largely include increased funding for the AirportLink project and Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements payments. The lapses in equity adjustments mainly reflect the timing of divestment of 50% of the department's financial investment in SEQ (Gold Coast) Desalination Company to the Queensland Manufactured Water Authority (WaterSecure). These lapses were partially applied to meet additional departmental services and administered items. Additional administered items reflect increased Commonwealth financial assistance grants for local governments.

- 16. Department of Justice and Attorney-General Additional departmental services reflect additional funding for workload increases and special prosecutions in the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions and the transfer of funding for the Public Safety Network. Lapses in equity adjustments were largely due to changes in the timing of capital expenditure mainly relating to courthouse facilities. These lapses were partially applied to meet additional departmental services and administered items. Additional administered items reflect increased Commonwealth funding and additional funding for Criminal Injury Compensation payments.
- 17. **Legislative Assembly and Parliamentary Service** Additional departmental services were provided for the relocation of certain electorate offices following redistribution of electoral boundaries and the implementation of electorate office security review recommendations. These were offset by lapses in equity adjustments due to changes in the timing of capital expenditure primarily relating to air conditioning cooling towers.
- 18. **Department of Local Government, Sport and Recreation** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Local Government, Sport and Recreation was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 19. **Department of Main Roads** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Main Roads was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 20. **Department of Mines and Energy** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Mines and Energy was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 21. Department of Natural Resources and Water Lapses in departmental services, due to changes in the timing of expenditure for dam spillway upgrade grants and water asset management and regulation, were applied to meet additional equity adjustments. Additional equity adjustments reflect funding carried forward from 2007-08 to 2008-09 for water initiatives. As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Natural Resources and Water was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 22. **Office of the Governor** The lapses in departmental services reflect funding carried forward from 2008-09 to 2009-10 relating to Fringe Benefits Tax interest expense, maintenance of property, plant and equipment and costs associated with upgrading existing systems for records management, the Governor's database and financial management system.
- 23. **Office of the Ombudsman** Additional departmental services reflect funding carried forward from 2007-08 to 2008-09 due to unspent employee expenses. This increase was partially offset by lower than anticipated accommodation expenses. Additional equity adjustments were provided for new accommodation fitouts for the Office.
- 24. Office of the Public Service Commissioner As a result of the *Public Service Act 2008*, the Public Service Commission commenced operations on 1 July 2008, replacing the Office of the Public Service Commissioner and the Service Delivery and Performance Commission.

- 25. **Department of Police** The lapses in departmental services reflect changes in the timing of operating expenditure from 2008-09 to 2009-10 mainly relating to the Public Safety Network, Technology Refresh and new and enhanced operational equipment. The lapses in equity adjustments reflect changes in the timing of capital expenditure from 2008-09 to 2009-10 associated with revised completion dates for general capital works, the Public Safety Network project and the Legacy Migration program.
- 26. **Department of the Premier and Cabinet** Lapses in departmental services, largely due to changes in the timing of operating expenditure, were partially applied to meet additional administered items. Additional administered items reflect funding received for the newly created Family Responsibilities Commission, which has now been transferred to the Department of Communities, partly offset by savings from Ministerial Offices and the Office of the Leader of the Opposition. The lapses in equity adjustments reflect changes in the timing of capital expenditure from 2008-09 to 2009-10 relating to the State Library Auditorium ('The Edge') adaptation works.
- 27. **Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 28. **Public Service Commission** Additional departmental services reflect funding for Urban Congestion Management and transitional arrangements for the Commission's new work program and relocation, partly offset by changes in the timing of operating expenditure from 2008-09 to 2009-10.
- 29. Department of Public Works The lapses in departmental services reflect changes in the timing of operating expenditure from 2008-09 to 2009-10. The lapses in equity adjustments were largely due to changes in the timing of capital expenditure relating to projects including the Boggo Road Precinct redevelopment and the Cairns government office building construction. These lapses were partially applied to meet additional administered items. Additional administered items reflect additional grant funding for claims under the Natural Disaster Relief Assistance scheme for various storms throughout Queensland and funding for Shared Service Agency initiatives.
- 30. **Queensland Audit Office** Additional equity adjustments were provided to assist with the Office's working capital needs relating to the implementation of the Annual Leave Central Scheme.
- 31. **Department of Tourism, Regional Development and Industry** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Tourism, Regional Development and Industry was abolished on 26 March 2009.
- 32. **Department of Tourism, Fair Trading and Wine Industry Development** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 4) 2007, the Department of Tourism, Fair Trading and Wine Industry Development was abolished on 13 September 2007.
- 33. **Department of Transport** As a result of the Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 2) 2009, the Department of Transport was abolished on 26 March 2009.

- 34. **Department of Transport and Main Roads** Additional equity adjustments reflect the reimbursement of property purchases for Airport Link and funding from the Australian Government for capital expenditure under its road funding programs in 2008-09. Additional administered items and lapsed departmental services reflect the reclassification of funding from controlled items to administered items relating to the TransLink Transit Authority. The lapses in departmental services were applied to administered items to reflect this reclassification.
- 35. **Treasury Department** Additional administered items were primarily due to the introduction of the Australian Government's First Home Owners Boost, funding provided by the Australian Government for the Queensland Rural Adjustment Authority (QRAA) and claims made against the Annual Leave Central Scheme. This increase also reflects the transfer of funds from the Queensland Future Growth Fund (QFGF) to the South East Queensland bulk water entities. The additional administered items were partially offset by lapses in departmental services due to a change in the funding for the South East Queensland (SEQ) Water Reform Transaction Implementation Unit from appropriation to user charges and deferral of funding to 2009-10 for the Revenue Management System.

# INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Treasurer of Queensland

# **Report on the Financial Report**

As required by section 30(1) of the *Auditor-General Act 2009*, I have audited the Consolidated Fund Financial Report which comprises the statement of receipts and payments for the quarter ended and year ended 30 June 2009, the statement of appropriations for the year ended 30 June 2009, other explanatory notes and the certificate given by the Treasurer of Queensland.

# Treasurer's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The Treasurer is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with prescribed requirements identified in the *Financial Accountability Act 2009*. This responsibility includes establishing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

# Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility to express an opinion on the financial report based on the audit is prescribed in the *Auditor-General Act 2009*. This Act, including transitional provisions, came into operation on 1 July 2009 and replaces the previous requirements contained in the *Financial Administration and Audit Act 1977*.

The audit was conducted in accordance with the *Auditor-General of Queensland Auditing Standards*, which incorporate the Australian Auditing Standards. These auditing standards require compliance with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and that the audit is planned and performed to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of risks of material misstatement in the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control, other than in expressing an opinion on compliance with prescribed requirements. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Treasurer, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

I believe that the audit evidence obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

# Independence

The *Auditor-General Act 2009* promotes the independence of the Auditor-General and QAO authorised auditors. The Auditor-General is the auditor of the Queensland Consolidated Fund and can only be removed by Parliament.

The Auditor-General may conduct an audit in any way considered appropriate and is not subject to direction by any person about the way in which audit powers are to be exercised. The Auditor-General has for the purposes of conducting an audit, access to all documents and property and can report to Parliament matters which in the Auditor-General's opinion are significant.

# Auditor's Opinion

In accordance with section 39 of the Auditor-General Act 2009 -

- (a) I have received all the information and explanations which I have required; and
- (b) in my opinion
  - the Treasurer's Consolidated Fund Operating Account and Treasurer's Consolidated Fund Investment Account, as defined in section 17 of the Financial Accountability Act 2009, have been properly kept in accordance with that Act;
  - (ii) the procedures applied were in accordance with the prescribed requirements and were adequate to ensure
    - proper control and safeguards were exercised over the collection, custody, banking, withdrawal, payment of, and accounting for, public moneys;
    - public moneys were appropriately entered in the consolidated fund accounts as received in, or paid out of, the Treasurer's consolidated fund bank account;
    - withdrawals from the Treasurer's consolidated fund bank account were made for lawful and appropriate purposes;
    - proper safeguards were followed to prevent fraud and mistake; and
    - the requirements of the law relating to public moneys were complied with in all material respects;
  - (iii) the Consolidated Fund Financial Report is in agreement with the Consolidated Fund accounts; and
  - (iv) the Consolidated Fund Financial Report has been properly drawn up so as to present a true and fair view of the transactions of the consolidated fund accounts for the financial year 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2009 and of the financial position of the accounts as at the end of that year.
